Primary majors cannot use any *target* language courses to satisfy AUCC core categories.

Transfer Credit: Students transferring credit from other universities (domestic or foreign) will be asked to provide detailed course descriptions/syllabi/tests/papers/etc. to the Department for review before the final degree/minor check is done (at the beginning of the graduation semester), otherwise graduation may be delayed. Any exception to this policy must be petitioned and approved by the Department. In order to facilitate evaluations (or *RE*-evaluations) being done in a timely fashion (when appropriate faculty are available and on campus), it is strongly recommended that students *complete their study abroad program one full academic year before graduation*. This policy is currently under review by the Department.
